 - this same word is used with Moses as he lies down, dies and goes to his fathers Deuteronomy 31:16 And the LORD said to Moses, "Behold, you are about to lie down with your fathers. Then this people will rise and whore after the foreign gods among them in the land that they are entering, and they will forsake me and break my covenant that I have made with them. - this word is used to speak of Lazarus before Jesus heals him because he is dead John 11:11-13 After saying these things, he said to them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep, but I go to awaken him." ¹² The disciples said to him, "Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will recover." ¹³ Now Jesus had spoken of his death, but they thought that he meant taking rest in sleep. - Paul says clearly that after the death of our body there is h of life after death; that our spirit will be in the presence of the Lord Philippians 1:23 I am hard pressed between the two. (4:15) For this we declare to you by a word from the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep.

- Paul is going to declare to us a word from the Lord; this word is not Paul's o_____
- those who have "fallen asleep" or have died, they will proceed to the Lord before those that are still alive!
- Jesus will come in the same manner that He went into heaven

Acts 1:9-11 9 And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, ¹¹ and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

- the resurrection of believers, the judgment of God and the creation of the new heavens and the new earth really happens at this event!
- here we do not see Paul talking about a secret rapture or two raptures, there is just one event!

(4:16) For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first.

- the Lord will descend upon the earth
- the Lord Jesus will bodily be upon the earth
- this 2nd coming of Jesus on the face of the earth will be loud and obvious
- i) cry of a command
- ii) a voice of the archangel
- iii) with the sounds of the trumpet of God
- a very v_____ and l____ event at the return of the Lord Jesus Christ
- concerned that those who had died would have no participation in the great day of the return of Christ
- Paul assures them these those who are dead in Christ will be raised f_____!

(4:17) Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air,

and so we will always be with the Lord.

- Paul talks about this expectation in 2 Corinthians
- **2 Corinthians 5:6-10** So we are always of good courage. We know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, ⁷ for we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸ Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹ So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. ¹⁰ For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil.
