## **Prayer Activism in 2 Thessalonians 1:11-12**

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#### 2 Thessalonians 1:11-12 (ESV)

<sup>11</sup>To this end we always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and may fulfill every resolve for good and every work of faith by his power, <sup>12</sup>so that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Introduction
- in the article called "Prayer Meeting", Clint Humphreys writes:
Charles Spurgeon reflected on the significance of corporate prayer meetings. He said:
How could we look for a Pentecost if we never met with one accord, in one place, to wait upon the Lord? Brethren, we shall never see much change for the better in our churches in general till the prayer-
meeting occupies a higher place in the esteem of Christians.
Do we want change in our lost society? Yes, we all do. But have we lost our confidence in the Lord and in
corporate prayer together, appealing to him? Have we started to look sympathetically at the Marxist
presupposition (adopted by both the Right and the Left) that everything is political?
If Christians are concerned about all of the activism which has spilled the banks of society, then maybe
we should all start with this other kind of grand activism—the activism of corporate prayer.
- we have all seen the rallies and the gatherings for certain political ideas for a while now
- but are we willing to gather together for?
- Paul in his letters to the Thessalonians has a serious emphasis upon prayer, this cannot be denied
- now, we need to be a people who focus upon communion with the Lord together!

- Paul speaks about this work of in the book of Philippians <b>Philippians 2:12-13</b> Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, your own salvation with fear and trembling, <sup>13</sup> for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

- most of you know the saying that "God is most glorified in us when we are most satisfied in Him" by John
Piper
- that statement is true indeed
- it could also be said, according to this passage, "God is most in us when we are empowered
by the Holy Spirit and the grace of God to live a life worthy of the Lord and seek to carry out the goodness and work of God"
- for our lives to give glory to God is one of the things we can do
- let us not be a people who seek to give glory to ourselves, but let our lives give glory to God
- just like that great song we sing — "All glory be to Christ the King!"
3) (1:12) What Fuels Prayer according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- I just absolutely love how Paul ends this section on prayer!
- Paul indicates that of this can be accomplished by human strength or human power
- just as the prophet Zechariah declared about how the Lord accomplishes His purposes
<b>Zechariah 4:6</b> Then he said to me, "This is the word of the LORD to Zerubbabel: Not by might, nor by power,
but by my, says the LORD of hosts.
- Biblical knowledge is good but apart from the of God and power of God you are not sanctified
- your ability to reason and to think critically is certainly an asset but apart from the grace of God and the
of God you are not sanctified
is God's favor or goodness shown to those who do not it
- God showing good to people who do not appreciate or even care about His goodness is grace
- God's is even offensive to Christians sometimes
- we see this in parable of the workers in the Vineyard
<b>Matthew 20:1-16</b> "For the kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house who went out early in the morning to
hire laborers for his vineyard. <sup>2</sup> After agreeing with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his
vineyard. <sup>3</sup> And going out about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the marketplace, <sup>4</sup> and to them he
said, 'You go into the vineyard too, and whatever is right I will give you.' <sup>5</sup> So they went. Going out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour, he did the same. <sup>6</sup> And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others
standing. And he said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' <sup>7</sup> They said to him, 'Because no one has
hired us.' He said to them, 'You go into the vineyard too.' <sup>8</sup> And when evening came, the owner of the vineyard
said to his foreman, 'Call the laborers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last, up to the first.' 9 And
when those hired about the eleventh hour came, each of them received a denarius. 10 Now when those hired
first came, they thought they would receive more, but each of them also received a denarius. 11 And on
receiving it they grumbled at the master of the house, <sup>12</sup> saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' <sup>13</sup> But he replied to one
of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? <sup>14</sup> Take what belongs to
you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. <sup>15</sup> Am I not allowed to do what I choose with
what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?' <sup>16</sup> So the last will be first, and the first last."
I have personally seen popula get upset when they hear this personal because cortainly Cod would not do that
- I have personally seen people get upset when they hear this parable because certainly God would not do that, because that would not be fair this parable shows God giving favour and goodness and
generosity to people who seemingly do not deserve it
- but God is generously gracious and we see just how generous He is with us by means of the of
His Son
- no one salvation from God, we deserve His, but God gives us grace and this
calling to the hope of eternal life
- but God's grace goes even further, His grace transforms us so that God can be glorified in us

#### Application

#### 1) Preach The Grace Of Christ To Yourself

- how important is the grace of God that is in Jesus Christ?
- Absolutely essential!
- we have heard a lot about what is essential and what is not essential, but we all need to be reminded that the Lord's word and grace is more essential than the air we breathe, the water we drink and the food we eat!

- Thanks be to God who shows us in the Lord Jesus - this grace, the Lord us out of darkness, the Lord choosing us to be the people of God, is a blessed hope
<ul> <li>- the work of Christ, taking upon our sin, rescuing us or saving us from the wrath to come, deals with our ultimate in life which is to be restored back to God</li> <li>- let the gospel and the grace of Christ be something that you do not social distance from ever as a Christian</li> <li>- let these wonderful truths of Christ be on your mind continually</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>I encourage you to preach to yourself the gospel of</li> <li>I encourage you to the character of the grace of God into your heart</li> </ul>
- Paul's teaching on the grace of God in Titus certainly connects to this passage <b>Titus 2:11-13</b> For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, <sup>12</sup> training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, <sup>13</sup> waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ,
2) Pray For One Another - as Paul has already encouraged us on prayer in the book of 1 Thessalonians, he continues to do so here in 2 Thessalonians
- as Paul commands us to pray without in 1 Thessalonians 5:17, he gives us another way we can pray for each other
- we ought to pray that we would be fueled by the of God for obedience
- we ought to pray that we would be by the grace of God for obedience
-we ought to pray that we would live lives that "glorify the Lord" with our in thought, word and deed
-we ought to pray that we would live lives that " for good" with our obedience in thought, word and deed
-we ought to pray that we would live lives that do the "work of faith" with our obedience in thought, word and
- we can be passionate about many things that are not bad in and of themselves, but let us be passionate about the Lord and His and have "prayer activism" and "prayer meeting activism" to the of the Lord!
