A Psalm of Asaph.

- **50** The Mighty One, God the LORD, speaks and summons the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting.
- ² Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God shines forth.
- ³ Our God comes; he does not keep silence; before him is a devouring fire, around him a mighty tempest.
- ⁴ He calls to the heavens above and to the earth, that he may judge his people:
- ⁵ "Gather to me my faithful ones, who made a covenant with me by sacrifice!"
- ⁶ The heavens declare his righteousness, for God himself is judge! *Selah*
- ⁷ "Hear, O my people, and I will speak; O Israel, I will testify against you. I am God, your God.
- ⁸ Not for your sacrifices do I rebuke you; your burnt offerings are continually before me.
- ⁹I will not accept a bull from your house or goats from your folds.
- ¹⁰ For every beast of the forest is mine, the cattle on a thousand hills.
- ¹¹ I know all the birds of the hills, and all that moves in the field is mine.

- ¹² "If I were hungry, I would not tell you, for the world and its fullness are mine.
- ¹³ Do I eat the flesh of bulls or drink the blood of goats?
- ¹⁴ Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving, and perform your vows to the Most High,
- ¹⁵ and call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me."
- ¹⁶ But to the wicked God says: "What right have you to recite my statutes or take my covenant on your lips?
- ¹⁷ For you hate discipline, and you cast my words behind you.
- ¹⁸ If you see a thief, you are pleased with him, and you keep company with adulterers.
- ¹⁹ "You give your mouth free rein for evil, and your tongue frames deceit.
- ²⁰ You sit and speak against your brother; you slander your own mother's son.

Introduction

- hypocrisy is a huge issue for the church and for many people who observe Christianity

Will Spokes in his article "Why are Christians Hypocrites?" writes:

Why are Christians such hypocrites? Why is the church responsible for so much injustice? For many people today the plausibility of Christianity is seriously undermined by the failures of Christians and Christian institutions, especially the church, to live in a manner consistent with Christian beliefs. Hypocrisy is a problem, and Christians shouldn't try to cover it up where it's present. Tim Keller defines hypocrisy this way, "an inconsistent person, a person that says one thing; does another, and knows that they are doing something wrong but puts up a front."

This objection to Christianity is often tied to the belief that religion of any kind poisons everything.
