
Psalm 75 ESV


To the choirmaster: according to Do Not Destroy. A Psalm of Asaph. A Song.

- In an article called "This Civil War General Uttered History's Most Ironic Last Words Just Before Getting Shot" written by Aimee Lamoureux

"If there's one thing that can be said about the general John Sedgwick, it was that he sure was confident.

"They couldn't hit an elephant at this distance."

These words were uttered by General John Sedgwick just moments before a Confederate bullet hit him in the left eye, killing him instantly. The irony of his last words and unexpected death are better remembered today than Sedgwick's military legacy, which led him into the path of that bullet at the Battle of Spotsylvania Court House in the American Civil War."
