¹⁸ And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, ¹⁹ addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, ²⁰ giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

"There Are Four Motivations For Getting Drunk: As far as psychologists are concerned, anyway. by Sarah Callinan

It's easy to see alcohol consumption being a result of thousands of years of ritual and a lifetime of habit. But have you ever stopped to consider why it is you choose to drink?

1) Drinking to Be Social

This fits in with the idea that drinking is mainly a social pastime. Drinking for social motives is associated with moderate alcohol use.

2) Drinking to Conform

These are the people who will sip a glass of champagne for a toast, or keep a wine in their hand to avoid feeling different from the drinkers around them.

3) Drinking for Enhancement

These young people (often male) are more likely to actively seek to feel drunk—as well as other extreme sensations—and have a risk-taking personality.

4) Drinking to Cope

Coping drinkers drink more heavily and experience more alcohol-related problems than those who drink for other reasons."

- now I know that grammar is the last thing that anyone wants to think about when you come to church
but in this passage the is essential for understanding the passage
- the main in this passage is 5:18 "Be filled with the Spirit" and the remaining verbs all the
way to Ephesians 6:10 hinge on or are to this verb "Be filled"
- this means that the remaining commands describe what it means to be with the Holy
Spirit
- if you want to know what it means to be with the Holy Spirit the next few commands all
describe what this looks like
- for instance if you are filled with the Holy Spirit you will out these commands
• 5:19 we will worship joyfully
 5:20 we will be thankful
 5:21 we will be submissive to the body of Christ
• 5:22-33 Husbands will love their wives and wives will submit to their husbands
6:1-3 Children will obey their parents
 6:4 Fathers will not provoke their children, but train them up in the Lord
6:5-8 Servants will serve their earthly masters as to the Lord
6:9 Masters will treat their servants in a God honoring way

1) (5:18) Be Filled
And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery,
- here we have the clear not to get drunk
- the New Testament is very clear that this is something that we are to Romans 13:13 Let us properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness,
not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy.
- do you see what is included in this Romans 13:13 alongside of getting drunk?
- the same theme is found Ephesians 5:18, we are to avoid being drunk with wine so that we
sexual immorality or debauchery
sexual initionality of debautilety
- why would Paul give such a command to this?
- certainly this would not be happening in church?
- how quick are we to forget the real in the early church
- do you remember those in who were getting drunk during the Lord 's Supper?
1 Corinthians 11:21 For in eating, each one goes ahead with his own meal. One goes hungry,
another gets drunk.

- some other reasons why Paul has included this command is because getting was a common practice in Roman culture and Paul wanted to contrast being under the influence of the Holy with being under the influence of
 - another reason why Paul has included this command was to speak out against - there was a god in Ephesus that people worshiped who was connected to wine - Paul wanted them to avoid the drunkenness and association with that god
- Paul is quoting from the book of with this command not to get drunk with wine Proverbs 20:1 Wine is a mocker, strong drink a brawler, and whoever is led by it is not wise.
Proverbs 23:31-32 Do not look at wine when it is red, when it sparkles in the cup and goes down smoothly. ³² In the end it like a serpent and stings like an adder.
 Paul is accurate, being can lead to a long list of bad decisions Paul highlights here the act of "debauchery" debauchery is extreme immorality we have a couple of examples of this found in the book of Genesis where drunkenness leads to

Romans 8:5-7 For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, those who live according to the set their minds on the things of the Spirit. ⁶ For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. ⁷ For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed, it cannot.

- this also means that by our behavior, thoughts, attitudes and actions we do not or grieve
the Holy Spirit Ephesians 4:30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

- you are reminded that Jesus loved you when you were an enemy and you ask the Spirit to create in your heart thankfulness for the work of Christ

forgive that person
- to be filled with the Holy Spirit is a upon the Spirit to you to live a holy life
- this means your life according to the Holy Spirit
Galatians 5:16-17 But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.
¹⁷ For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the
flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do.
