Colossians 3:22-4:1 ESV

²² Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord. ²³ Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, ²⁴ knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ. ²⁵ For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality.

4 Masters, treat your bondservants justly and fairly, knowing that you also have a Master in heaven.

respondents were either looking for work, or would consider jumping ship if

approached with the right opportunity.

Among 1,001 Canadians and 1,000 Americans surveyed for the company's annual Pulse of Talent report, 37 per cent said they were either actively or casually looking for a new job, and 36 per cent say they'd consider a new position if recruited.

Perhaps unsurprisingly, better pay was the reason cited most often for accepting a new job — but not by a landslide. After compensation, people were most likely to leave because they didn't find their work interesting, followed closely by not feeling respected, and by lack of opportunity to take on new responsibilities.

- according to this survey, 73% of the people are not happy in their jobs and would leave their job
- those statistics are alarming
- I am not here to say "stay in your job" but I do want to encourage you, as Paul does in this passage, to see your job as where the Lord has placed you so that you can do ministry
- if all you are thinking when you go off to work is "I owe, I owe so off to work I go" you are not doing all things for the glory of the Lord
- yes we do need money to survive and that is one of the reasons why we work
- but we also need to know a few things as we go to work
- 1) the Lord commands us to reflect His glory wherever we go
- 2) the Lord has placed us in our workplace to declare the greatness of Jesus Christ
- I can speak first hand that some of the professing Christians that we employed in our family business were some of the worst working employees that we ever had
- that was not true of every professing Christian that we employed but it certainly was true for some of them
- Christian, let it be said of us that we are the best and most dedicated workers, so much so that your employer wants to hire more people from our church
- the Lord calls the Christian to a different standard and we are given a higher calling
- that calling, as explained in this passage, is to see our work as to the glory of God
- God is not a physical earthy boss but the Lord calls us to work for our employer as we work for the Lord

- before we get into the book of Colossians it is important to mention 4 important points about slavery and work
1) the slavery that is found in the New Testament is not equivalent to the

- in fact there is a book called "Slavery as Salvation", by Dale B. Martin, which
highlights that a person who entered into slavery during times actually
enhanced their life instead of starving to death
2) the slavery mentioned does not fully our work environment in Canad

- obviously none of us are slaves and slavery is in Canada

Likewise he who was free when called is a of Christ. ²³ You were bought with a price; do not become bondservants of men.
