Introduction and Background

A member of a certain church, who previously had been attending services regularly, stopped going.

After a few weeks, the pastor decided to visit him. It was a chilly evening. The pastor found the man at home alone, sitting before a blazing fire. Guessing the reason for his pastor's visit, the man

welcomed him, led him to a big chair near the fireplace and waited. The pastor made himself comfortable but said nothing. In the grave silence, he contemplated the play of the flames around the burning logs.

After some minutes, the pastor took the fire tongs, carefully picked up a brightly burning ember and placed it to one side of the hearth all alone. Then he sat back in his

chair, still silent. The host

watched all this in quiet fascination. As the one lone ember's flame diminished, there was a momentary glow and then its fire was no more. Soon it was cold and "dead as a doornail."

Not a word had been spoken since the initial greeting. Just before the pastor was ready to leave, he picked up the cold, dead ember and placed it back in the middle of the fire. Immediately it

began to glow once more with the light and warmth of the burning coals around it. As the pastor reached the door to leave, his host said, "Thank you so much for your visit and especially for the fiery sermon. I shall be back in church next Sunday."

 2) Jesus' Spirit Descends upon the Believers others think that Paul is referring to God the Spirit descending upon the believers in 2 at Pentecost but this cannot be true because the text clearly says that it is who descends not the Holy Spirit
 3) Jesus Descends upon the Earth in the Incarnation I believe this is the accurate interpretation since uses this word "descend" several times to speak about His incarnation the incarnation means "God takes on flesh in the person of Jesus Christ" o John 3:13 No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. o John 6:33 For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."
