- hear what Beth Tanner in her commentary on Psalm 57 writes:

"We are daily bombarded by fear. The news tells us murder, rape, and slaughter until it seems an unsafe proposition to ever set foot outside our own door. The advertisements are constantly offerings us a cream or pill to ward off death, or a home security system to protect what belongs to us, or a car that will protect us from all ills; but all of these are fallacies. Our trust ______ in God and only in God. Refuge will not be found in the security that humans create, but in trust in the God to care for us when we are threatened."

Now David and his men were sitting in the innermost parts of the cave. ⁴ And the men of David said to him, "Here is the day of which the LORD said to you, 'Behold, I will give your enemy into your hand, and you shall do to him as it shall seem good to you.'" Then David arose and stealthily cut off a corner of Saul's robe.
