- if you remember the confession of Peter in the gospel of Mark it is different than the confession that of Peter in Matthew and Luke

Mark 8:29 And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the"
b) Jesus is the Messiah - Mark records the confession of Peter this way to emphasize that Jesus is the suffering Messiah - Jesus is the Christ and that means that Jesus is the one who was by God to suffer in place of sinners

 - in 2012, the great hymn "In Christ Alone" was involved in a controversy with a church denomination hymnal committee in the US. - the hymnal committee requested permission from Gettys to use an alternate lyric for the phrase "Till on that cross as Jesus died/the wrath of God was satisfied", changing " of God was satisfied" to "the love of God was" - the Gettys rejected this lyric change, and in the end, the hymnal committee barred the hymn from their hymnal.

Mark 1:16-20 Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and the brother of casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ And Jesus said to them,
"Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." ¹⁸ And immediately they left their nets
and followed him. ¹⁹ And going on a little farther, he saw the son of Zebedee and
his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. ²⁰ And immediately he called
them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed him.
