

- Peter starts this letter out with a reminder to these Christians that they are the of God
- they have been chosen by God according to the foreknowledge of God, the sanctification of the Holy Spirit and the sprinkling of the blood of Christ (1 Peter 1:1-2)
 in 1 Peter 1:3-5, Peter launches into to God for His wonderful grace Peter praises God for the new and the living hope through the resurrection of Jesus from the dead
 Peter praises God for the inheritance of heaven which will not perish, spoil or Peter praises God because the Lord protects His people by His power so that they will be till the 2nd coming of Jesus Christ
 in 1 Peter 1:6-9, Peter deals with the challenging topic of the lifestyle of these Christians reveals to us what faith looks

1) (1:10) Salvation Prophesied Concerning this salvation, the prophets who prophesied about the grace that was to be yours searched and inquired carefully,
- Jesus gives to His people a new birth or the ability to be " again"
- yes, the gospel of Jesus Christ is the news of God's grace
 Peter writes that the prophets "searched and inquired carefully," these prophets were in seeking to find out more about the Messiah, who would deliver the grace of God to sinful people
2) (1:11) Spirit of Christ
(1:11) inquiring what person or time the Spirit of Christ in them was indicating when he predicted the sufferings of Christ and the subsequent glories.
- 1 Peter 1:11 teaches us two important truths about the prophets

- Peter in his 2 nd letter writes this! 2 Peter 1:19-21 And we have the prophetic word more fully confirmed, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts, 20 knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. 21 For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.
#2) the prophets the death and resurrection of Jesus - we see this when Peter writes "predicted the sufferings of Christ and the subsequent glories" a) the prophets predicted the of Christ
- the most notable passage is from the prophet of Israel who in Isaiah 53 says this about Jesus - this passage is also quoted by Peter in 1 Peter 2:24 Isaiah 53:3-7 He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. 4 Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. 7 He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth

 the most important passage that predicts the resurrection of Jesus Christ in the Old Testament is Psalm 16 written by King Psalm 16:10 is quoted in several sermons in the book of Acts and this shows that David
prophesied the resurrection of Jesus Christ Psalm 16:10 For you will not abandon my soul to Sheol, or let your holy one

- these prophets fully understood what they had prophesied - but now that Christ has come, their words are clear and it is evident that the prophecy has been
- hear the words of Christ as He addressed His disciples at the end of the gospel of Luke! Luke 24:44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."
