

Introduction
- an important part of growing in the Lord is understanding our in Jesus Christ
- hear this quote from David Lomas about identity:
Identity drives motivation, motivation drives action, and action drives results. For example, if someone speeds past me at ninety miles per hour on the highway, odds are I won't chase them down and issue a ticket. I don't have an identity that says, "I am a police officer," so I have no motivation to act. A police officer, on the other hand, does have that identity and therefore has the motivation to take action (chasing down the speeder) and get results (issuing a ticket). Every action we take in life has a sense of identity behind it. How we see ourselves matters.

Colossians 1:21-22 And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, <sup>22</sup> he has
now in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and
above reproach before him,
- because of Christ's reconciling work we are made and blameless before God
-furthermore, because of Christ's work we are now set apart for God

- because we are holy by Christ's work, we are called to live holy lives

(2:10) Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people;
- in 1 Peter 2:10, Peter is using the book of Hosea to speak about the grace of God to a believer
- the prophet Hosea spoke during some very tumultuous times in the life of Israel
- Israel had been extremely against God
- in the book of Hosea, does not mince any words, he claims that Israel is filled with
whoredom
- Israel is just like an wife
- Israel is extremely unfaithful to the Lord
Hosea 1:2 When the first spoke through Hosea, the LORD said to Hosea, "Go, take to
yourself a wife of whoredom and have children of whoredom, for the land commits great whoredom by forsaking the LORD."
- Hosea is commanded by God to marry a prostitute and he has three children
- the child that Hosea has is "Lo Ruchamah" which in Hebrew means "no mercy"
Hosea 1:6 She conceived again and bore a daughter. And the LORD said to him, "Call her name No
, for I will no more have mercy on the house of Israel, to forgive them at all.
- this child symbolized what Israel had become because of their wickedness
- but although Israel deserves judgment for their sin, the Lord does not abandon His people
Hosea 2:23 and I will sow her for myself in the land. And I have mercy on No Mercy, and
will say to Not My People, 'You my people'; and he shall say, 'You are my God.'"
- Peter writes to these Christians who were Gentiles
- because they are they were not Jewish and thus were not considered God's people
- but because of the grace of God they were brought into the of God with all the benefits o
belonging to His, since they had received mercy through Jesus Christ
8) (2:10) Now Have Received Mercy

- His third child is called "Lo Ammi" which in Hebrew means "not my"
Hosea 1:8-9 When she had weaned No Mercy, she conceived and bore a son. 9 And the LORD said, "Call
his name Not My, for you are not my people, and I am not your God." 10 Yet the number of
the children of Israel shall be like the sand of the sea, which cannot be measured or numbered. And in the place where it was said to them, "You are not my people," it shall be said to them, " of
the living God."
