

### By His Wounds You Are Healed! 1 Peter 2:22-25 ESV

#### 1 Peter 2:22-25 ESV

<sup>22</sup> He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. <sup>23</sup> When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly. <sup>24</sup> He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. <sup>25</sup> For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

#### Introduction and Review

- the book of 1 Peter is amazing because Peter is totally consumed with \_\_\_\_\_

- there are 8 amazing truths about who they are in Jesus Christ, they are:

- 1) A Chosen Race 2) Royal Priesthood 3) Holy Nation 4) A People For His Own Possession
- 5) Called Out of Darkness 6) Called Into God's Marvelous Light
- 7) Now a People 8) Now Have Received Mercy

- then Peter speaks to three areas of submission or subjection

- 1) 2:13-17 Christians are to be subject to the state
- 2) 2:18-20 Christian servants are to be subject to their masters
- 3) 3:1-7 Wives are to be subject to their husbands

#### Isaiah 53:4-12

## 1) (2:22-23) Righteous Christ

- in 1 Peter 2:22-23, Peter highlights the righteousness of Jesus Christ by explaining 5 characteristics of Jesus Christ

### 1. *Jesus never sinned*

(2:22) "He committed no sin"

**Hebrews 7:26** For it was indeed fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, innocent, unstained, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens.  
**1 John 3:5** You know that he appeared in order to take away sins, and in him there is no sin.

**John 8:46** Which one of you convicts me of sin? If I tell the truth, why do you not believe me?

### 2. *Jesus never spoke any words of deceit*

(2:22) "neither was deceit found in his mouth."

### 3. *Jesus never reviled*

(2:23) "When he was reviled, he did not revile in return;"

**Mark 15:32** Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross that we may see and believe." Those who were crucified with him also reviled him.

#### 4. *Jesus never threatened*

(2:23) "when he suffered, he did not threaten,"

**Luke 23:34** And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide his garments.

#### 5. *Jesus always entrusted Himself to the Righteous Judge*

(2:23) "but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly."

**Revelation 16:7** And I heard the altar saying, "Yes, Lord God the Almighty, true and just are your judgments!"

### 2) (2:24) Righteousness Given

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree,

a) substitutionary atonement

b) gives us a clean record

that we might die to sin and live to righteousness.

c) Jesus gives us new life

By his wounds you have been healed.

d) Jesus gives us healing

### 3) (2:25) Return to Christ

(2:25) For you were straying like sheep,

a) you were...

i) “straying sheep”

ii) acknowledge and confess

**Psalm 119:176** I have gone astray like a lost sheep; seek your servant, for I do not forget your commandments.

but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

b) but now...

i) “returned”

ii) “shepherd”

**John 10:11** I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

iii) “overseer”

## Application

### 1) Christ Died For You!

a) the cross of Christ is essential to Christianity!

- in the hymn “At the Cross” Isaac Watts makes this point about the work of the cross of Christ

*Was it for crimes that I had done He groaned upon the tree?*

*Amazing pity! grace unknown! And love beyond degree!*

b) 3 amazing truths and their benefits

1. Jesus bears our sins in His body on the tree

**Romans 8:1** There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

2. Jesus sets us free from the authority of sin

3. Jesus heals us from Sin

## **2) Christian, You Are Dead to Sin!**

a) the Christian is dead to sin

**Romans 6:1-11** What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? <sup>2</sup> By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? <sup>3</sup> Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup> We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. <sup>5</sup> For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. <sup>6</sup> We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup> For one who has died has been set free from sin. <sup>8</sup> Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. <sup>9</sup> We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. <sup>10</sup> For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. <sup>11</sup> So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

b) victory over sin

c) pursue Christ above all
