

Sermon Outline Persecuted For Purity — 1 Peter 4:4-6

1 Peter 4:4-6 ESV

⁴With respect to this they are surprised when you do not join them in the same flood of debauchery, and they malign you; ⁵ but they will give account to him who is ready to judge the living and the dead. ⁶ For this is why the gospel was preached even to those who are dead, that though judged in the flesh the way people are, they might live in the spirit the way God does.

Introduction

1 Peter 1:6-7 In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, ⁷ so that the tested genuineness of your faith—more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

- 1) (4:4) Godless Living
- 2) (4:5) Give Account
- 3) (4:6) Gospel Preached

1) (4:4) Godless Living

(4:4) With respect to this they are surprised when you do not join them in the same flood of debauchery, and they malign you

- a) "this" new way of living
- **1 Peter 4:2-3** so as to live for the rest of the time in the flesh no longer for human passions but for the will of God. ³ For the time that is past suffices for doing what the Gentiles want to do, living in sensuality, passions, drunkenness, orgies, drinking parties, and lawless idolatry.

b) No longer wanting to live the old way

- they were astonished that these Christians no longer partook of:
 - i) sensuality desires that violate God's design for marriage
 - ii) passions lust
- iii) drunkenness getting intoxicated
- iv) orgies drinking parties with an excess of food, alcohol and sexual immorality
- v) drinking parties
- vi) lawless idolatry indulging in the worship of false idols and false gods
- c) no longer living with debauchery
- the word debauchery means "corrupt, sinful, wicked or depraved"

Ephesians 5:18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit,

d) but living with slander and insults

2) (4:5) Give Account

(4:5) but they will give account to him who is ready to judge the living and the dead.

Psalm 7:11 God is a righteous judge, and a God who feels indignation every day.

the author of Ecclesiastes concludes his book with this truth
 Ecclesiastes 12:13 The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man. ¹⁴ For God will bring every deed into judgment, with every secret thing, whether good or evil.

- Paul declares that at the 2nd coming of Jesus, He will judge the living and the dead
- **2 Timothy 4:1** I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom:
- let us not forget these two truths about the Lord
 - i) He is a holy God who will punish sin
 - ii) He is a gracious God who has given us the great gift of Jesus Christ to deal with our sin

3) (4:6) Gospel Preached

(4:6) For this is why the gospel was preached even to those who are dead,

- a) 3 proposed interpretations
 - i. the gospel was preached to those who are dead and are in hades
 - 1 Peter 3:19 in which he went and proclaimed to the spirits in prison.
 - ii. the gospel was preached to those who are "spiritually dead"

 Ephesians 2:1 And you were dead in the trespasses and sins
- iii. the gospel was preached to people who are now dead
- b) preaching the gospel is of the utmost importance
- c) 5 aspects of the gospel in 1 Corinthians 15
- Paul makes the gospel message very clear in 1 Corinthians 15:1-8
- **1 Corinthians 15:1-8** Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, ² and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you-- unless you believed in vain. ³ For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶ Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷ Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸ Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me.

Acts 1:9-11 And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, ¹¹ and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

3) Persecution Because of Purity

1 Thessalonians 4:3-7 For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from sexual immorality; ⁴ that each one of you know how to control his own body in holiness and honor, ⁵ not in the passion of lust like the Gentiles who do not know God; ⁶ that no one transgress and wrong his brother in this matter, because the Lord is an avenger in all these things, as we told you beforehand and solemnly warned you. ⁷ For God has not called us for impurity, but in holiness.
