

Suffering: What to Do and What to Avoid (1 Peter 4:12-15)

1 Peter 4:12-15 ESV

¹² Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery trial when it comes upon you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. ¹³ But rejoice insofar as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed. ¹⁴ If you are insulted for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. ¹⁵ But let none of you suffer as a murderer or a thief or an evildoer or as a meddler.

Introduction

1) (4:12) Suffering is Not a Surprise or Strange

(4:12) Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery trial when it comes upon you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you.

a) "beloved"

- they are "beloved" for three reasons
 - 1. they are loved by God
- God loves them by giving His one and only Son (John 3:16)
 - 2. they are loved by Jesus Christ

1 John 4:10 In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

3. they are loved by Peter

by be prepared for trials because of your anegiance to christ
John 15:18-19 "If the world hates you, know that it has hated me before it hated you. 19 If you were of the world, the world would love you as its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you.
2 Timothy 3:12 Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted,
1 Peter 4:4 With respect to this they are surprised when you do not join them in the same flood of debauchery, and they malign you;
c) be prepared for suffering
i) trials transform - the Lord uses trials in the lives of Christians to
1 Peter 1:6-7 In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, 7 so that the tested genuineness of your faith more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.
ii) trials remind us we belong to Christ

2) (4:13) Sufferings of Christ

(4:13) But rejoice insofar as you share Christ's sufferings,

a) rejoice in suffering

Acts 5:40-41 and when they had called in the apostles, they beat them and charged them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go. 41 Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name.

- b) be reminded of the joy we have because of the sufferings of Christ
- 1 Peter 3:18 says "Jesus suffered for our sins"

that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed.

- c) be reminded of the joy we will have when Christ is revealed
- 1 Peter 5:1 So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed:
- 1 Peter 5:4 And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory.
- 1 Peter 5:10 And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you.

3) (4:14-15) Suffer for Good and Not Evil

(4:14) If you are insulted for the name of Christ, you are blessed,

a) an insult is a blessing

b) identified with Jesus Christ

1 Peter 3:14 But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled,

c) the promised blessing of the Holy Spirit

Matthew 5:11 "Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account.

Because the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you.

(4:15) But let none of you suffer as a murderer or a thief or an evildoer or as a meddler.

d) live holy lives

1 Peter 3:10-12 For "Whoever desires to love life and see good days, let him keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit; 11 let him turn away from evil and do good; let him seek peace and pursue it. 12 For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil."

4 Sins to be avoided:

- 1) murder (murderer)
- 2) stealing (thief)
- 3) rebellion against God (evildoer)

4) meddling (meddler)

Application

1) The Sufferings of Jesus Christ

1 Peter 2:24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed.

2) The Blessings of Trials

4:13 – rejoice that you share in Christ's sufferings

4:13 - rejoice and be glad

4:14 – if you are insulted because of Christ, you are blessed

Romans 5:3-5 Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, 4 and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, 5 and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

3) Hope of Heaven

Revelation 21:3-4 And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. 4 He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away.
