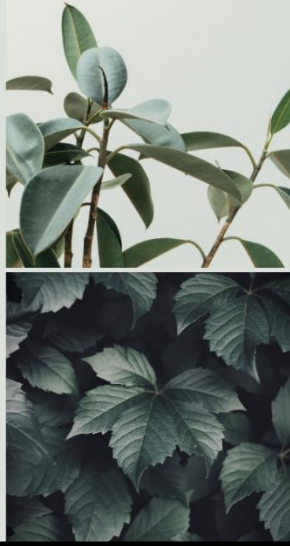

1 Peter 5:5-7 ESV

⁵ Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." ⁶ Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, ⁷ casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you.

Introduction

1) (5:5a) Submission

(5:a) Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders.

a) submission/subjectation

- instances where Peter mentions submission

- i) Peter exhorts the Christians to be in submission to the state

1 Peter 2:13 Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme,

- ii) Peter exhorts servants to be in submission to their masters

1 Peter 2:18 Servants, be subject to your masters with all respect, not only to the good and gentle but also to the unjust.

- iii) Peter exhorts wives to be in submission to their husband

1 Peter 3:1 Likewise, wives, be subject to your own husbands, so that even if some do not obey the word, they may be won without a word by the conduct of their wives,

- iv) and finally, we hear about how all angels, authorities and powers are in submission to Jesus Christ

1 Peter 3:22 who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him.

b) congregational life

Hebrews 13:17 Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you.

1 Thessalonians 5:12-13 We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, ¹³ and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves.

2) (5:5b-6) Humility

(5:5b) Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another,

a) a Christian characteristic

Philippians 2:3 Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves.

- here are 5 reminders of how we ought to live out the “one another” with each other
 - i) live in harmony with each other

Romans 12:16 Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight.

ii) bear with one another in love

Ephesians 4:2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love,

iii) do not repay evil for evil but to do good

1 Thessalonians 5:15 See that no one repays anyone evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to everyone.

iv) love one another

1 John 3:11 For this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another.

for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

c) the Lord will punish sin

Proverbs 3:34 Toward the scorners he is scornful, but to the humble he gives favor.

d) but the Lord gives grace

(5:6) Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you,

e) see the truth about ourselves

f) the mighty hand of God

Deuteronomy 26:8 And the LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with great deeds of terror, with signs and wonders.

- the Christian is called to humble themselves before this great and mighty God who is able to deliver and save

g) promises for the humble

Matthew 23:12 Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted.

3) (5:7) Trust in the Lord

(5:7) casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you.

a) lay them down

b) the Lord's loving kindness

Psalm 55:16-23 ¹⁶ But I call to God, and the LORD will save me. ¹⁷ Evening and morning and at noon I utter my complaint and moan, and he hears my voice. ¹⁸ He redeems my soul in safety from the battle that I wage, for many are arrayed against me. ¹⁹ God will give ear and humble them, he

who is enthroned from of old, Selah because they do not change and do not fear God. ²⁰ My companion stretched out his hand against his friends; he violated his covenant. ²¹ His speech was smooth as butter, yet war was in his heart; his words were softer than oil, yet they were drawn swords. ²² Cast your burden on the LORD, and he will sustain you; he will never permit the righteous to be moved. ²³ But you, O God, will cast them down into the pit of destruction; men of blood and treachery shall not live out half their days. But I will trust in you.

Application

1) Look to the Beauty of the Lord

Philippians 2:5-11 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

2) Give Your Worries to Jesus Christ

Matthew 6:25-34 "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? ²⁷ And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? ²⁸ And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹ yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ³⁰ But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? ³¹ Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' ³² For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. ³³ But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. ³⁴ "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.
