



Baptism's Profound Significance for Christians: Colossians 2:8-15

Colossians 2:8-15 ESV

⁸ See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ. ⁹ For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, ¹⁰ and you have been filled in him, who is the head of all rule and authority. ¹¹ In him also you were circumcised with a circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, ¹² having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead. ¹³ And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵ He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.

Introduction and Background

Luke 14:26 "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple.

1) (2:8) Deceptive Teaching

- (2:8) See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ.
- Paul starts this section with a warning to avoid being taken captive a) be alert and aware

2) (2:9-10) Divinity of Jesus
(2:9-10) ⁹ For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, ¹⁰ and you have been filled in him, who is the head of all rule and authority.
a) the divinity of Jesus Christ and b) the authority of Jesus Christ
a) the divinity of Jesus Christ
- Paul has already talked about this in the great hymn of Jesus found in Colossians 1:15-20
Colossians 1:19 For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell,

3) (2:11-15) Dead and Made Alive

- in Colossians 2:14, Paul describes how all of our sins can be forgiven

Acts 3:19 Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out, ²⁰ that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, and that he may send the Christ appointed for you, Jesus,

Application

1) Baptism Reminds Us of Our New Life in Christ

- Baptism reminds Christians of two important truths:
- 1) as we go under the water this symbolizes, we were dead in sin,
- 2) as we are brought up out of the water this symbolizes the new life that Jesus gives freely to those who trust in Him

Ephesians 2:1-5 And you were dead in the trespasses and sins ² in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience-- ³ among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. ⁴ But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, ⁵ even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ-- by grace you have been saved--

2) Baptism Reminds us of the Amazing Benefits of Knowing Christ

i) fullness of life

- ii) no longer ruled by sin
- we were ruled by sin, but we died to sin, so that sin is no longer our master and our ruler (2:11)
- iii) no longer have a sin record
- sin brought death, but through Jesus Christ we are raised to new life (2:12)
- the washing of water in the act of baptism reminds us that all of our sins are washed away (2:13)

Jeremiah 31:34 And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

iv) a baptism brings joy

3) Repent, Believe and be Baptized

i) always rebelling - repent

Ecclesiastes 7:29 See, this alone I found, that God made man upright, but they have sought out many schemes.
