

Psalm 80: The Good Shepherd and Embracing God's Promises of HopePastor Adam Hall I I Tryden First Baptist Church I Dec 3, 2023

Introduction and Background

**2 Kings 17:5-8** Then the king of Assyria invaded all the land and came to Samaria, and for three years he besieged it. <sup>6</sup> In the ninth year of Hoshea, the king of Assyria captured Samaria, and he carried the Israelites away to Assyria and placed them in Halah, and on the Habor, the river of Gozan, and in the cities of the Medes. <sup>7</sup> And this occurred because the people of Israel had sinned against the LORD their God, who had brought them up out of the land of Egypt from under the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt, and had feared other gods <sup>8</sup> and walked in the customs of the nations whom the LORD drove out before the people of Israel, and in the customs that the kings of Israel had practiced.

#### 1) (80:1-3) Prayer for Deliverance #1

(80:1-2) 1 Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock. You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth. <sup>2</sup> Before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh, stir up your might and come to save us!

a) 3 things asked of the Lord

- 1. give ear
- 2. shine forth
- 3. stir up your might

#### b) appeal to the Shepherd

Psalm 23:1 The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.

c) appeal to God's sovereignty

# d) appeal to be restored(80:3) Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved!

#### 2) (80:4-7) Present Anger

<sup>4</sup> O LORD God of hosts, how long will you be angry with your people's prayers? <sup>5</sup> You have fed them with the bread of tears and given them tears to drink in full measure. <sup>6</sup> You make us an object of contention for our neighbors, and our enemies laugh among themselves. <sup>7</sup> Restore us, O God of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved!

a) consequence of unrepented sin

**Hosea 5:9** Ephraim (another name for the Northern Kingdom) shall become a desolation in the day of punishment; among the tribes of Israel I make known what is sure.

1. God's anger

2. the people's tears/sorrow

3. neighbour's contention

3) (80:8-15) Past Mercy a) be remined of grace and mercy

(80:8-11) <sup>8</sup> You brought a vine out of Egypt; you drove out the nations and planted it. <sup>9</sup> You cleared the ground for it; it took deep root and filled the land. <sup>10</sup> The mountains were covered with its shade, the mighty cedars with its branches. <sup>11</sup> It sent out its branches to the sea and its shoots to the River.

b) by grace Israel was brought out of Egypt

c) by grace Israel became a prosperous nation

d) asking for grace again

(80:12-15) <sup>12</sup> Why then have you broken down its walls, so that all who pass along the way pluck its fruit? <sup>13</sup> The boar from the forest ravages it, and all that move in the field feed on it. <sup>14</sup> Turn again, O God of hosts! Look down from heaven, and see; have regard for this vine, <sup>15</sup> the stock that your right hand planted, and for the son whom you made strong for yourself.

4) (80:16-19) Prayer of Deliverance # 2

(80:16-19) <sup>16</sup> They have burned it with fire; they have cut it down; may they perish at the rebuke of your face! <sup>17</sup> But let your hand be on the man of your right hand, the son of man whom you have made strong for yourself! <sup>18</sup> Then we shall not turn back from you; give us life, and we will call upon your name!

a) remembering history

Application 1) Hope in Jesus and His Work Accomplished for You

a) our good shepherd

John 10:11 I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

**John 10:14-16** I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, <sup>15</sup> just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup> And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.

b) the vine in the promised land

**Colossians 1:12-14** giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. <sup>13</sup> He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, <sup>14</sup> in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

#### 2) Do You Have the Hope of Eternal Life?

**Revelation 21:3-4** And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. <sup>4</sup> He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."

#### 3) When In Trials Remind Yourself of God and His Work

#### a) 3 amazing truths about the Lord

Psalm 143:4-5<sup>4</sup> Therefore my spirit faints within me; my heart within me is appalled. <sup>5</sup> I remember the days of old; I meditate on all that you have done; I ponder the work of your hands.

#### b) ponder truths and be encouraged
